- The British Election Study is a non-partisan, objective independent study providing world-class data and research into British general elections
- More than 1 million BES Questionnaires completed since 1964
- High quality random probability in-person surveys after every general election since 1964
- Approximately 55,000 downloads of data since May 2015
- Large online internet panel, 30,000 people per 'wave'
- 447 articles using BES data (since 2014)
- *Electoral Shocks: Understanding the Volatile Voter in a Turbulent World*, published 2019
- *Electoral Realignment: how Brexit re-shaped British elections*, to publish autumn 2024
- Political Studies Association Prize: Research Communicator of the Year Award 2015, Pippa Norris Prize for outstanding contribution to advancing knowledge, 2023
- Department of Politics, and International Relations: Impact Leader Award 2023
- Around 1,500 BES mentions in the media since 2014
- Britain's longest running social science survey (1964, 2015 UK general election, 2017 UK general election, 2019 UK general election, present day...)
